Owned by the Terzian Family for decades, this 132-acre parcel in Hague, NY, was sold to LGLC in November of 2014 after an overwhelmingly successful fundraising campaign. The project was the perfect example of a community effort and thanks to the neighbors of Sabbath Day Point and Silver Bay all the monies for acquisition and stewardship were raised in three short months!

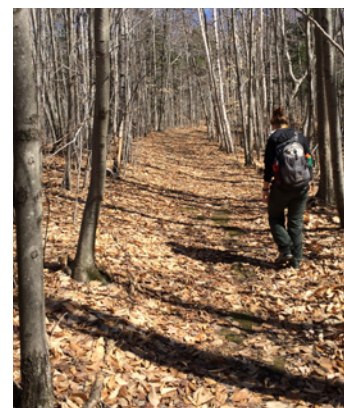
Many individuals, families, and organizations contributed towards the conservation of the Terzian Woodlot. Please see the back of this sheet for a complete list of donors.

The acquisition of this property has allowed LGLC to ensure the protection of a Lake George tributary, create public access to beautiful forests and ridges, and provide habitat and refuge for the endangered timber rattlesnakes. If you see any snakes, please keep a safe distance and do NOT share its location with others (to keep the snakes and curious people safe from unnecessary encounters).

A total of 1.5 miles of trails have been established and connect to trails on the Silver Bay YMCA property. Trails for Silver Bay YMCA can be found on their website (see www.silverbay.org/campus-map/). If you would like to hike their trails, they ask that you become a member of Silver Bay.

Rt 9N/Lake Shore Dr., Hague NY

GPS: 43.669592, -73.512633

Driving on Rt 9N, from the south the preserve entrance is on the left, 75 feet past Carney Point Drive, where there is a sign post without a sign. Drive in for 250 feet, bearing to the right and park in field. The Orange trail starts at NW corner. Please use the Town of Hague's gravel pit for parking in the winter months (750 feet to the south).

The Orange trail is 1.4 miles in length and leads to two waterfalls; the 0.1 mile Yellow trail breaks off from the Orange trail and goes to an expansive scenic view over Lake George at Uncas Cliff.
