

In 2015, after five years of negotiations, the 73-acre Pinnacle property was finally protected thanks to a partnership between LGLC, the Town of Bolton, and the FUND for Lake George, which provided major financial support for its acquisition. In addition, nearly 300 individuals, families, businesses and foundations contributed to the project. The enormous outpouring of community support was essential to the project's success, and helped to make this a landmark achievement.

This trail system was expanded in 2021, when the LGLC and Town of Bolton partnered again to protect 62 acres connected to The Pinnacle — Bradley's Lookout. Together, these properties provide spectacular views of Lake George with minimal effort, while also protecting the water quality of the lake.

These lands and the adjoining Bolton Community Center are at the epicenter of the Bolton Recreational Hub, a collaborative project created to promote conservation, recreation and community resilience. For more about the Hub, visit lgc.org/projects/bolton-recreational-hub.



RED TRAIL TO THE PINNACLE - -

 Moderate; mostly gradual inclines, 1/2-mile section of steeper, rocky ascent.

 1.55 miles to summit (ave. 45-60 minute hike)

 Trail includes a wooden bridge ; ends at an overlook with expansive view  of Lake George.

YELLOW TRAIL TO CAT MT —

 Moderate; includes some steep sections.

 1 mile to Edgecomb Pond Rd (from there, turn right and walk north along Edgecomb Pond Road for 0.3 miles to get to the Cat Mt. trailhead)

 The yellow trail follows private property boundaries to Edgecomb Pond Road, where it crosses onto Town of Bolton property. Please respect landowner privacy and stay on marked trails (see the Cat & Thomas Trail Guide for details on those trails).

BLUE TRAIL TO BRADLEY'S LOOKOUT =

 Moderate; mostly gradual incline, short section of steeper ascent near the lookout. 174-ft total elevation gain, ave. 5% grade (max. 11% grade).

 0.6 miles to summit (ave. 20-30 minute hike)

 Great, short option for families and those looking for an easier way to a great view  of Lake George.
