

LGLC Hunting Rules:

These rules apply to ALL of the LGLC Preserves that are open to hunting.

- Be aware that our preserves are open to the public for uses other than hunting: the safety of preserve users must be your highest priority.
- Respect neighbors, LGLC staff, and other preserve users
- Hunting is NOT permitted on every land owned by the LGLC. For a list of LGLC lands that allow hunting, check our website or email <u>mdore@lglc.org</u>
- Hunters must comply with all New York State laws and hunting regulations
- Do not hunt within 500 feet of a marked trail or property boundary
- Hunter permits are not transferable to other people. If issued, a hunting permit is valid for one specific individual permit holder only
- Permits are valid for one year only, and only for the dates or hunting seasons specified on the permit. You must request and receive permission each year that you wish to hunt on allowed LGLC preserves.
- Stay within the boundaries of the allowed hunting preserve. If a wounded deer leaves the LGLC preserve, do not track it onto private property without first obtaining the permission of that landowner
- Trapping is prohibited
- Hunting stands are prohibited
- No motorized vehicles, horses, or bicycles permitted on the preserve
- Park at the designated parking area of the LGLC preserve. Do not park on the side of roads
- Do not cut or mark your own trails
- Camping and overnight access are prohibited
- Do not remove vegetation
- Fires are prohibited
- Two copies of the permit will be provided to each permit holder: carry one permit with you at all times that you are hunting on LGLC land, and display the other on your vehicle's dashboard.
- As a private landowner, the LGLC reserves the right to suspend hunting activities on any of our lands and at any time.

Remember: Hunting on LGLC property is a privilege and not a right. Please be respectful of our rules so that we can continue to allow hunting on these lands.
